

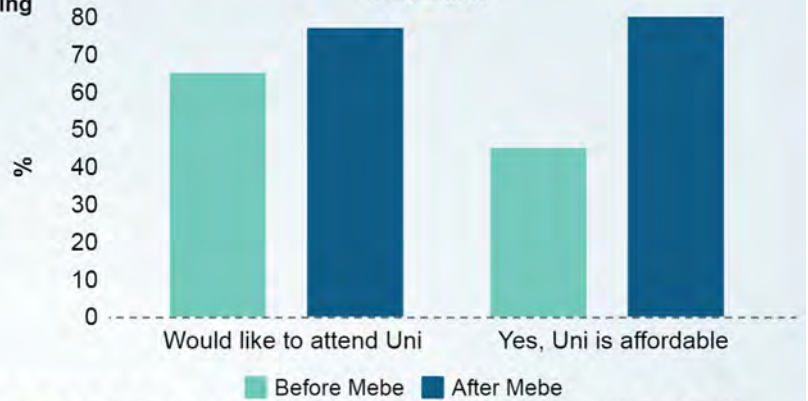

Books and Stories Scheme

Helping students reach their reading potential. This initiative has been employed by the Southern Universities Network (SUN) and resulted in delivery to over 100 pupils in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight.

77% of pupils increased their reading age by a mean average of 10 months



Mentoring and Tutoring Scheme

Using role models to provide information and inspiration to Year 10 pupils to help inform decisions about their future. 156 mentees took part in intensive interventions in coordination with nine target schools.



71% of teachers said the scheme "exceeded" their expectations



100% of mentees felt that the scheme had a positive outcome



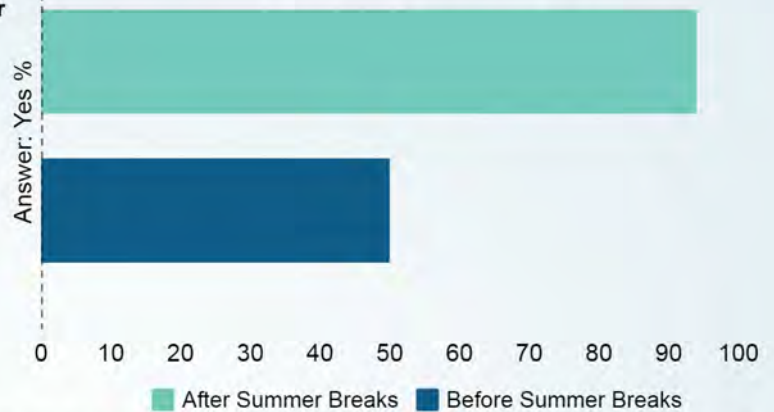
